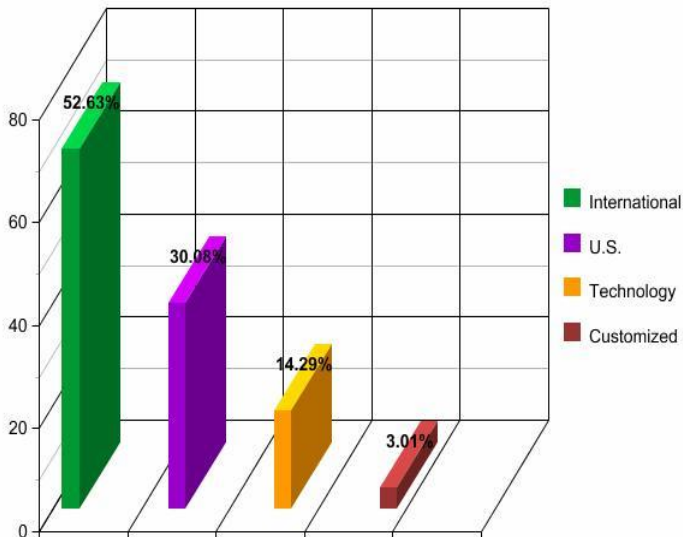

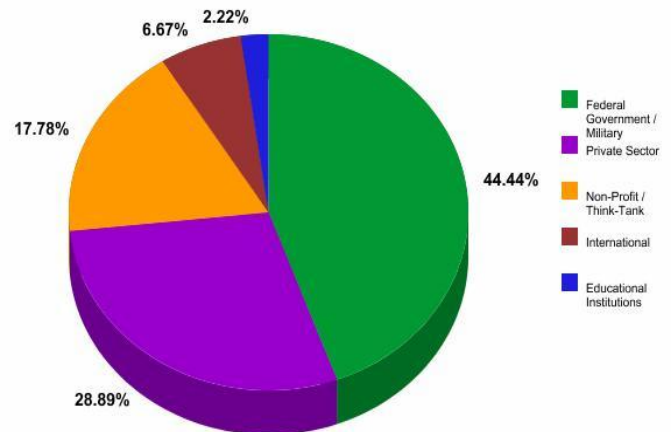

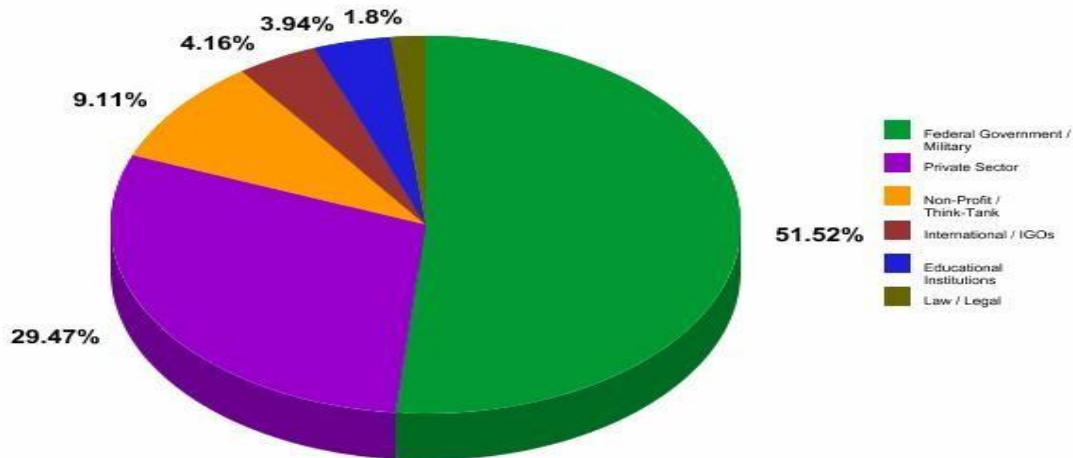

UNITED STATES FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AND ARMED FORCES**

Of the 889 Security Studies Program alumni who have submitted employment placement information, 458 (51.5%) responded as being employed by either the U.S. Federal Government or by one of the branches of the United States military.

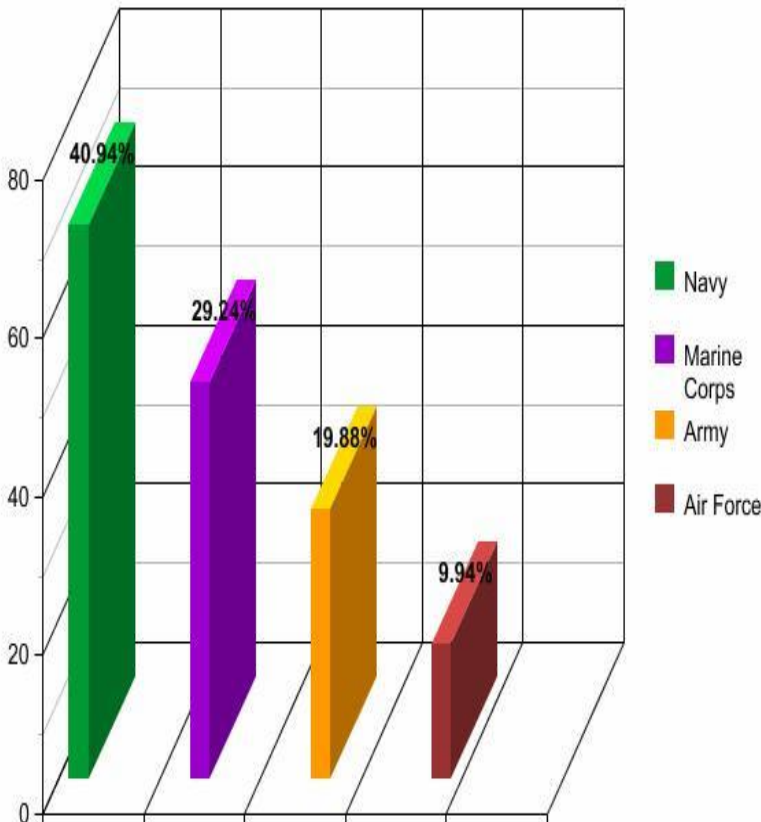
